

## California Entrance Requirements for Dogs

### California Health & Safety Code Section 121720

Pursuant to California Health & Safety Code Section 121720, persons bringing dogs into California (e.g., out of state or from international locations) with intent to sell or transfer ownership must have a **health certificate** completed by a licensed veterinarian within the 10 days prior to the date of importation. Any person seeking to bring a dog into the County of San Diego, from out of state or international locations, shall submit the original health certificate to the County health department at the address below. The receiving party (e.g., pet stores, rescues, owners, breeders) may reject any shipment of dogs that arrive without valid health certificates. All persons transporting dogs via commercial air should contact the airline for any additional requirements.

The receiving party shall submit the original **health certificate** (i.e., no copy) **for each dog**, via mail or in person, to the County health department at:
